ON ARRIVAL	 <ul style="list-style-type: none">Supplied as a pair of established plants in 3L pots, ready to plant.Remove all packaging on arrival and prior to planting.	
WHERE TO PLANT	<p><u>PLANTING IN-GROUND (BED OR BORDER)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Grow in well-drained soil with plenty of sun, as shade can reduce the number of flowers produced.Prepare the soil in which these Agapanthus will be planted by removing weeds, stones, and any other debris from the area.Place the plants, potted, on the surface of the ground to give yourself a good visual idea of how you want to arrange them, before knocking each plant out of its container. Aim to plant each Agapanthus roughly 50cm apart from one-another to give them room to spread, while remaining close enough for a neat and uniform display.Dig a hole just deep and wide enough to fit the existing root ball, aiming to bury the roots while leaving the base of the stem above ground.Firm the soil around the plant, using either your hand or heel, depending on the clump size, then water in well even if the ground is already moist or rain is forecast. <p><u>PLANTING IN CONTAINERS OR BASKETS</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">When growing in pots, plant using a loam-based compost with one single plant suited to a 20-23cm container.Typically, more flowers will grow when roots are restricted, so pot-growing is preferred and can lead to more impressive flowering shows.	
WATERING	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Water regularly across the growing season, particularly during the first year after planting.Once your Agapanthus have established, watering should only be needed during prolonged spells of hot and dry weather.	
PRUNING / TRIMMING	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Pruning is simple, with just deadheading needed when the flowers start to fade. Cut these off at the base to encourage the plant to flower even longer.Alternatively, seedheads can be left on the plant into the cold months to provide early winter interest.	
FEEDING	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Feed those planted in borders during spring when growth first emerges using a balanced fertiliser, such as Blood, Fish, and Bone.For pot-grown Agapanthus, apply a liquid fertiliser once every two weeks from April until flowers start to show colour.	
WINTER CARE INSTRUCTIONS	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Container-grown plants will need protection from autumn by moving them to a light and frost-free spot, such as a greenhouse. The Agapanthus can be wrapped in horticultural fleece from November to April for protection.Help to protect those plants in borders by spreading a 15cm layer of mulch around the bases from the middle of autumn, before removing in spring when fresh growth begins.	
CONTAINER SIZE + RECOMMENDED NUMBER OF PLANTS PER CONTAINER	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Each individual Agapanthus plant should be grown in a container with a diameter of 20-23cm.
