THIS SELECTION CONTAINS	Rosa Amirose 2 x 12cm Pots
ON ARRIVAL	 On arrival give your roses a drink before planting. Plant in either container or border Water in well after planting.
WHERE TO PLANT	- Border - Plant in sunny aspect in a rich soil - Container – Plant in a sunny aspect in a rich soil
WATERING	Water deeply and regularly, especially during dry periods. It's best to water at the base of the plant to keep the foliage dry and prevent diseases. Avoid overhead watering.
PRUNING / TRIMMING	In early spring, before new growth begins, prune the stems to about one-third their height. Avoid a hard prune you may give to a bush rose Remove any dead, diseased, or congested branches. Cut back inward growing stems to allow greater airflow through the centre of the plants. Throughout the blooming season, deadhead spent flowers to encourage more blooms.
FEEDING	Feed roses with a balanced rose fertilizer or a general-purpose fertilizer. Apply in early spring, after the first bloom, and again in mid-summer.
WINTER CARE INSTRUCTIONS	In late autumn, after the first frost, apply a thick layer of mulch around the base of the plant to insulate the roots. Mound soil or compost around the base of the rose for extra protection
CONTAINER SIZE + RECOMMENDED NUMBER OF PLANTS PER CONTAINER	Each will need a deep 40cm pot as rose roots go deep.



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
